10 students from Years 10 and 12 attended the annual **Oxford Globals Novice Nations MUN** conference between 7th to 9th February.

As with the last conference we attended in November, this was an incredible experience for our students, with hundreds of delegates attending from schools

across the globe. Students spent three days, in their individual committees, debating and coming up with solutions to a range of global issues, ranging from climate change to equitable development of new technologies and many more. Our students did incredibly well across every committee they were involved in and demonstrated exceptional leadership, speaking and diplomatic skills. MUN does, however, have a competitive element to it and we were so proud to see five of our students win awards during the conference. Special congratulations to Camille Vannier, Connie Lamek and Lilia De Souza who won awards in their first ever conference and to Sarah Dennis who won an award despite, not only attending her first ever conference, but had only joined MUN a few weeks ago and was therefore the least experienced member of our delegation!

My personal highlight of the weekend, however, was witnessing a truly titanic struggle in the 'Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice' between two rival blocs of countries, one of which was led by our Year 10 students Natalie Worsley and Shyla Patalasingh. They spent the weekend in opposition to a bloc of countries led by highly experienced 'MUNers' (they are pictured to the right in one of their many tense negotiations with their opponents) and triumphed on the final day by having their resolution narrowly passed instead and had to use all of their charismatic speaking and diplomatic skills to come out on top!

The club continues to go from strength to strength and our students are already looking forward to our next major conference coming up at the London School of Economics in March.

Boys' Football

The school's football teams have had an eventful and competitive season, with several squads achieving success in their respective leagues and competitions.

The 7A team performed well, narrowly missing out on a play-off spot, while the 7B team had a solid season, securing three wins. The 8A team faced some challenges, but showed potential for the future.

The 9A team enjoyed another successful season and are just one victory away from reaching the District Final. Meanwhile, the 9B team made an impressive run, reaching the later stages of the National Cup.

The 10A team had a mixed campaign in the District league but have progressed to the quarter-finals of the County Plate. The 11A team came heartbreakingly close to the District final, missing out by just two points, yet their season was still a success.

The 1st XI emerged as league champions, winning the District league and securing a place in the District Final later this term, where they will aim to finish the season on a high.

Rugby

This half term has seen the official start of our school rugby season. However, the weather has hampered this with only a handful of games being played.

The Year 7 team started with superb wins vs Queens' School and Dame Alice Owens School. A lot of promise in that group of students. The Year 8 team have also committed well to training but have only played one game in which they fell to a strong Queens' side. Years 9 and 10 are still awaiting their first games of the season, hopefully with success coming.

Girls' Football

Girls' football has had a fantastic run this half term, with continued success across multiple age groups. The U13 girls have shown great progress, steadily developing their skills and teamwork. Meanwhile, the U14 girls delivered impressive performances in the County Cup, securing their spot in the semi-finals after strong matches against Beaumont and Sandringham. Matching their success, the U15 girls have also fought their way to the semifinals, demonstrating determination and skill. Both teams will compete in their semi-final matches next half term, with high hopes of reaching the finals and achieving county glory!



Netball

Badminton




